National Day for Truth and Reconciliation:

The City of Port Colborne will recognize and observe Sept. 30 as National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The first observance of a National Day for Truth and Reconciliation was Sept. 30, 2021, following the identification of unmarked burials at former Indian Residential School sites.

The City of Port Colborne has raised the Every Child Matters flag at City Hall to remember and honour the survivors of the residential school system, and the children who never made it home.



For individuals interested in educational resources, visit the Port Colborne Public Library to explore its collection of books by Indigenous authors, illustrators, and publishers. The collections include adult and children's titles.



Members of the public are invited to attend the screening of the film "Orange Shirt Day" about the life of Orange Shirt Day founder Phyllis Webstad. This event will take place, Saturday, Sept. 30 at 2 p.m. in the L.R.Wilson Archives.



The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation also coincides with Orange Shirt Day, which began in 2013 and encourages people to wear orange shirts to honour Indigenous children forced to leave their families to attend residential schools.

Municipal offices, including City Hall, Operations Centre, Port Colborne Public Library, Roselawn Centre, and L.R. Wilson Heritage Research Archives, will be closed on Saturday, Sept. 30, 2023, to recognize Sept. 30 as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The Vale Health & Wellness Centre, Sugarloaf Marina, and Port Colborne Historical & Marine Museum, including Arabella's Tea Room, will remain open, operating regular business hours.





WHAT'S IN THE WORKS WITH PUBLIC WORKS

Spring Street Sweeping Operations

Our annual street sweeping operations are underway. Here are a few ways you can help city staff:

- Minimize street parking where possible
- Do not sweep your driveway and sidewalk debris onto the road
- Leave road debris from the gutter or edge of the road where it is
- Remove hockey and basketball nets from the edge of the road



Fall Storms - Keeping Catch Basins & Culverts Clear

Historically, October and November bring more extreme weather events, largely due to higher volumes of rain. With leaves falling and debris on the ground, catch basins and culverts tend to become congested with leaves, sticks and other foreign objects from trees bushes and shrubs. Residents are being asked to keep their culvert and catch basins free of debris to minimize the potential of flooding.

Also, during high volume rain events, residents are encouraged to limit water usage at home to reduce the possibility of sewer backups and the chances of surcharging the storm and sewer systems.

As a safety measure, residents are encouraged to avoid any creeks, ditches or streams with high water levels or fast moving water.



Water Service and Sewer Lateral Replacement Grants and Loan Program:

As part of the 2022 Water and Wastewater Budget, City Council approved a grant and loan program to assist residents with the cost to replace their water line and/or sewer line. As shown in the picture below, the City is responsible for the water and sewer lines extending from the watermain or sewermain in the road to your property line; however, property owners are responsible for the water and sewer lines that run from your property line to your home.



Why replace a water or sewer line?

While the private water and sewer lines are the responsibility of the property owner, when any of the issues listed below become known on the section which is owned and maintained by the City, the City or one of their approved contractors, will repair or replace the City's side of the line(s).

There are many different reasons a property owner may need to replace their water or sewer line:

- When a water or sewer line is found to be damaged, leaking, deteriorating, or undersized
- If the water line is constructed with lead pipe

All residential property owners who receive a water/wastewater bill are eligible to apply for and receive the following grant(s) and/or loans:

Replacement Grants:

Water Line	\$1,000		
Sewer Line	\$1,000		

Replacement Loans:

Water Line	\$2,500
Sewer Line	\$2,500

You can manage property taxes, water and wastewater bills online with the City's launch of Virtual City Hall.



NEW PAYMENT METHOD

Use a credit card to make full or partial payments directly to property and utility accounts (a convenience fee will be charged for any online payments made with a credit card through the third-party merchant Paymentus).

GO PAPERLESS

Sign-up for paperless billing. Anyone who activates paperless billing will receive a one-time credit up to \$25 (\$10 for property taxes and \$15 for water/wastewater). The incentive has been extended until Dec. 23, 2023. Also, if you set up pre-authorized payments for your property and water/wastewater accounts you can also receive an additional one-time credit up to \$25.

ACCESS PROPERTY INFORMATION

Access property information that is provided to the City by Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC), including searching for properties to view assessments and tax information.

Note: When creating your account, please use the name exactly how it appears on your bill.
