REOPENING PORT COLBORNE

Port Colborne, along with the Niagara region, remains in Stage 3 of the Province's reopening framework. As the City continues with a safe and gradual recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, more restrictions are being lifted allowing residents greater use, and access to municipal services and outdoor spaces.

The City's municipal offices at City Hall, 66 Charlotte Street, is scheduling appointments Mondays - Thursdays from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. for residents requiring access to City services. Departments accepting appointments at City Hall include • Corporate Services (for example, marriage licenses and commissioning). Residents and businesses will not be able to make appointments to pay property taxes or water/wastewater bills. • Planning Division • By-law Enforcement Division • Building Division • Mayor's Office • Community Services (Parks and Recreation) • Economic Development • Chief Administrative Officer •

Reopening Recreation at the Vale Health & Wellness Centre

In accordance with public health guidelines, the following recreational programs are back up and running:

Pickleball

Pickleball programming is set to open to the public beginning Monday, November 2, 2020. One-hour time slots are available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Participants must register in advance and cost is equivalent to \$5 per hour for each participant.

Zumba

Indoor Zumba classes are running every Monday and Wednesday, 7 - 8 p.m. Cost is \$5 and participants must register in advance.

Walking Track

The walking track is available Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. - 12 p.m. and 1 - 4 p.m. Walkers will be required to wear a mask and will need to sign-in at the upper level upon arrival.

Rinks 1 and 2

Both Rinks at the Vale Health & Wellness Centre are now operational and have welcomed back athletes from Port Colborne Minor Hockey, Girls Wave Hockey, and the Southern Tier Admirals. At this time, to ensure the health and safety of residents, visitors and staff, we will not be hosting public events, tournaments or public skating programs.

Did you know, two ships in the Royal Canadian Navy during the Second World War were named for our local communities: H.M.C.S Port Colborne, a River class frigate, and H.M.C.S. Humberstone, a Castle class corvette? The crews of these vessels were "adopted" by the local community, who sent care packages, letters, and cards. It was a way to provide the crew with some extra comforts and let them know people were thinking about them. These and many more stories of how people reached out to each other at a distance during wartime are still an inspiration to us today.

Halloween

If you're planning on celebrating Halloween this weekend, please remember to follow the advice from Public Health, including:

- Only go out with members of your household;
- Only trick or treat outside;
- Do not travel outside of your neighbourhood to celebrate Halloween;
- Both trick or treaters and people handing out candy should wear a face covering. A costume



- mask is not a substitute for a face covering and should not be worn over a face covering as it may make it difficult to breathe;
- Do not congregate or linger at doorsteps and remember to line up two metres apart if waiting. Avoid high-touch surfaces and objects;
- Whether collecting or handing out treats, wash your hands often and thoroughly, or use hand sanitizer;
- Do not leave treats in a bucket or bowl for children to grab and consider using tongs or other similar tools to hand out treats;
- Avoid gatherings with people outside of your household;
- Stay home if you are feeling ill, even if you have mild symptoms, or if you are at higher risk for serious illness from COVID-19.
