Proof of Vaccine

The City of Port Colborne is committed to ensuring the health and safety of residents and staff. Effective Sept. 22 the following City facilities require people to be fully vaccinated and provide proof of their vaccination status. along with photo ID, to gain access.

Vale Health & Wellness Centre:

- Any adult (18+) accessing the facility for any purpose, including parents or guardians
- of youth participating in an organized sport, walkers and the general public
- Youth (12+) that are spectating and not actively participating
- COVID-19 screening will also be in effect for all individuals entering the building

Youth under 18 years of age actively participating in an organized sport, including training, practices, games and competitions, patrons with a medical exemption, and workers or volunteers (including coaches and officials) are not required to provide proof of vaccination at the Vale Health & Wellness Centre. Individuals can provide proof of vaccination by downloading or printing their vaccine receipt from the provincial booking portal https://covid19.ontariohealth.ca/, or by calling the Provincial Vaccine Booking Line at 1-833-943-3900. Those with medical exemptions must provide proof as identified by the Province in order to access facilities. For more information, visit portcolborne.ca/covid19.



Fall Storms - Keeping Catch Basins & Culverts Clear

Historically, October and November bring more extreme weather events, largely due to higher volumes of rain. With leaves falling and debris on the ground, catch basins and culverts tend to become congested with leaves, sticks and other foreign objects from trees bushes and shrubs.

Residents are being asked to keep their culvert and catch basins free of debris to minimize the potential of flooding.

Also, during high volume rain events, residents are encouraged to limit water usage at home to reduce the possibility of sewer backups and the chances of surcharging the storm and sewer systems.

As a safety measure, residents are encouraged to avoid any creeks, ditches or streams with high water levels or fast moving water.

The City of Port Colborne's Public Works team is committed to making Port Colborne a vibrant place to live and play. If you can walk on it, drive on it, drink it, flush it, bike on it, skate on it, play on it and work on it, more than likely it was the City's Public Works team that was taking care of it! Check out some of the great projects and initiatives happening in your community thanks to Public Works.

Upcoming Improvements to your Neighbourhoods

Erie Street Watermain Replacement

We have retained Associated Engineering to provide a design and tendering of 755 metres of cast iron watermain from Killaly Street West to Neff Street. The design is in the 90% phase and after a few final touches this project will be going out for construction. Due to unique circumstances in Port Colborne, including shallow bedrock, watermain isolation and randomness of existing storm infrastructure, the consultant and City staff decided it would best to install the watermain in a new alignment. Construction is expected to start in early 2022 with completion mid-late spring of 2022.

Chippawa/Dolphin/Berkley Intersection Improvements

As a result of internal and external consultation, Public Works staff will be moving forward with procuring the reconstruction of the Chippawa/Dolphin/Berkley intersection. This project will also address the speeding concerns along Chippawa Road. Various measures have been employed in attempt to address these issues such as installation of speed radars and mitigation markers. In efforts to help lower traffic and truck volume along Chippawa Road, additional local traffic only and no truck signage has been installed.

Speed Radar Signs

Public Works has acquired three pairs of speed radar signs that will be set up temporarily at various locations. Their first locations are on Clarence Street, Bell Street, and Chippawa Road. The devices



log data such as number of cars exceeding the speed limit, times of day when majority of speeding occurs, and days of the week when speeding is most prevalent. This data will help us determine whether a problem exists and will also assist the police in planning the most efficient use of their resources when enforcing traffic laws.

Street Light Repairs

City Council has recently approved budget to repair several street light locations which have been off for extended periods because they require more work to repair than typical outages. The locations include lights on West Street, Main Street West, and several on Clarence Street. The repairs will be completed throughout the next year.

Road Resurfacing

Rankin Construction is currently in the city completing the 2021 road resurfacing list. In total, we have 16 roads receiving new asphalt. To view the 2021 road resurfacing list, visit https://portcolborne.ca/en/living-here/roads.aspx.

Friendship Trail Standards

Public Works staff are currently conducting internal and external consultation to create and implement standards for the Friendship Trail, including trail crossings. These efforts are to upgrade and unify the trail's current standards.



We Remember

2021 marks the 100th anniversary of the remembrance Poppy in Canada. In July of 1921 the Great War Veterans Association adopted the Poppy as the flower of Remembrance. To honour this milestone and to commemorate those who protected our freedom, the Port Colborne Historical & Marine Museum will have a Poppy installation on the museum grounds from November 4 - 11, 2021.
