## REOPENING PORT COLBORNE

Effective March 1, Port Colborne along with the Niagara region, moved to Red-Control under the Keeping Ontario Safe and Open Framework. As Niagara begins to reopen we will work with Niagara Region Public Health to communicate new reopening updates as they become available.

### Coming Soon! Digital COVID-19 Screening

In an effort to simplify the COVID screening process for all employees, visitors and contractors who visit City facilities or worksites, the City will be implementing a new COVID-19 Digital Self-Screen. More information will become available soon.

### Vaccinations

As of March 22, individuals 75 years of age or older, or an individual trusted to make an appointment on their behalf, can book a vaccine appointment. The City is working closely with Niagara Region Public Health to open the Vale Health & Wellness Centre as a vaccination clinic on April 7, 2021. Until the vaccination clinic opens in Port Colborne, residents are still able to access vaccination clinics in other municipalities.






## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT WATER!



### Drinking Water

The Regional Municipality of Niagara draws water from the Welland Canal and treats it to make it safe to drink. Then the water is sent to the Fielden Avenue Reservoir, or the Barrick Road Water Tower, and then to the City-owned water distribution system and to our homes and businesses. The City of Port Colborne takes pride in ensuring that its residents are provided with clean and safe water, free of any pollutants that could jeopardize their health. Certified operators collect water samples throughout the distribution system each week. Samples are analyzed for free chlorine levels and microbiological parameters. Additional chemical tests are performed as required. Standards for drinking water are set and legally enforced by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA). The City of Port Colborne's drinking water consistently meets all Ontario Drinking Water Quality Standards.

### Wastewater

Wastewater is collected from Port Colborne homes and businesses by the City's wastewater collection system, which is made up of approximately 90 km of sewer mains. Wastewater is then emptied into one of the Region's 17 sewage pumping stations and then pumped to the Region's Seaway Wastewater Treatment Plant. There it is treated and then discharged back into the Welland Canal.

### Storm Water

Stormwater is the water from rain or melting snow that is not absorbed into the ground. In urban areas (in the city), stormwater goes into storm sewers (the grated drains found on streets), which empty directly into streams, the Canal or Lake Erie. Managing stormwater and drainage is key to preserving the health of our water.

### Water - Wastewater Billing

How the City pays for its water and wastewater services is determined annually by the rate budget. The rate budget covers day to day operations of water and wastewater services. These services are included in your water bill.
