COVID-19 COMMUNITY UPDATES

Effective April 17 at 12:01 a.m., additional province-wide restrictions were implemented to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and help save lives. This includes extending the Stay-at-Home order for an additional two weeks, closing outdoor facilities like golf courses, soccer fields, basketball courts and marinas, and stopping all non-essential construction. Everyone is asked to stay at home and only travel for essential purposes, such as going to the grocery store or pharmacy, accessing health care services (including getting vaccinated), for outdoor exercise, or for work that cannot be done remotely. These additional and strengthened public health and workplace safety measures will be in effect until May 21, 2021.

During the Stay-at-Home order, the City of Port Colborne will implement the following changes to City-run outdoor amenities:

- Skate Park closed
- Beaches closed
- Sports fields, courts, picnic tables and pavillions closed
- Parks and trails will remain open for passive use only, allowing for walkthrough access
- Sugarloaf Marina and boat ramp closed

Vaccinations

Niagara Region Public Health is making strides in vaccinating Niagara residents. To date, more than 30% of residents have been vaccinated. Here's an update on vaccinations in Niagara:

- Adults 60 years or older can now book appointments online to be vaccinated at a Public Health vaccination clinic
- Adults 40 years or older can book an appointment through a participating pharmacy.

Update: Sugarloaf Marina & Beaches

As announced by the Ontario government, new restrictions to boating activities have been implemented to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The City of Port Colborne will be closing the boat ramp and Sugarloaf Marina until regulations have changed. As well, during the Stay-at-Home order, both Centennial-Cedar Bay Beach and Nickel Beach will be closed to the public. This includes passive use like walking, nature observation and canoeing/kayaking, and no gathering is permitted. Premises will be monitored, and violation is subject to penalty. FARM 911 - The Emily Project

Port Colborne Fire & Emergency Services launches FARM 911 as part of the **Emily Project initiative.**

The Emily Project - FARM 911 permits address signage to be installed on rural farmlands that normally do not have civic addresses. The address signs help to provide a street address location in case of an emergency, which can lead to a more efficient and effective emergency service response. Property owners of rural farmlands can now submit an application through the City's website to have a FARM 911 address sign installed. The application fee per address sign is \$115 (including HST). Spring Clean Up

The 2021 Spring season has arrived, and the City of Port Colborne is reminding residents to ensure grass and weeds do not exceed the height of 15cm (6 inches) on their properties. In Port Colborne, every property owner is responsible for maintaining their lawn, and failure to do so will result in an order placed on the property, giving 72 hours to clear grass/weeds exceeding 15cm (6 inches). 


Record Membership

WHAT'S IN THE WORKS

The City of Port Colborne's Public Works team is committed to making this community a vibrant place for residents to live, work and play. If you can walk on it, drive on it, drink it, flush it, bike on it, skate on it and play on it, more than likely it was the Public Works team taking care of it. Here are some great initiatives and projects happening in your community thanks to the Public Works team.

Improvements to H.H. Knoll Lakeview Park

As part of the Canadian Experiences Fund, the City received financial support to make improvements to H.H. Knoll Lakeview Park with the goal of enhancing tourism initiatives, updating facilities, and creating new experiences for both residents and visitors. Over the last year, City staff were able to make improvements to existing park foundations, while adding new infrastructure including electrical work to support concerts and events like Canal Days. Upgrades and improvements to H.H. Knoll Lakeview Park include the following:

- The Cenotaph was restored, which included significant flagstone repairs, bronzing of the plaques and lights and LED lighting was added at the top of the hill.
- · LED lighting upgrades to the washroom, splashpad pumphouse, bandshell and both pavilions.
- After the Oct. 31, 2019 storm, there was significant tree damage throughout the park. City staff corrected all tree and pole damage and ensured playground equipment was intact.
- In Spring 2020, new trees were planted throughout the park.
- In partnership with Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority a pollinator bed was created in Spring 2020.
- The asphalt walkway around the park was repaved to ensure a smooth service making it accessible and barrier-free for all residents and visitors to enjoy.

Speed Radar Sign

The Public Works Department is in the process of acquiring four Speed Radar Signs for use at various locations throughout the City. One of the first locations planned for these signs is the intersection of Chippawa Road, Dolphin Street, and Berkley Avenue. Speed Radar Signs are effective at raising driver awareness in regards to the speed at which they're travelling. Please drive safe Port Colborne.

School Zone Flashing Signals

Council has approved the installation of Flashing Signals in the school zone on Killaly Street East at St. Therese School to indicate when the speed limit is 40km/h. The regular speed limit will be raised back to 50km/h for all other times of day. Flashing signals have been proven to be effective at reducing traffic speed when activated. The goal of installing these signals is to have the speed of traffic reduced during the most critical times; when a high volume of pedestrian traffic, especially children, is present.

Spring Street Sweeping

The City's annual street sweeping is currently underway!

Here are a few ways you can #PORTicipate and help out City staff:

- · Minimize street parking where possible
- Do not sweep your driveway and sidewalk debris onto the road
- · Do not sweep the gutter or edge of road material into a pile
- · Remove hockey and basketball nets from the edge of the road

Hydrant Flushing

The City performs annual hydrant maintenance activities, which includes flow testing and flushing, to ensure adequate water flow for fire fighting activities, fire sprinkler systems, residents, and businesses.
